to reflect their priorities in the action taken.

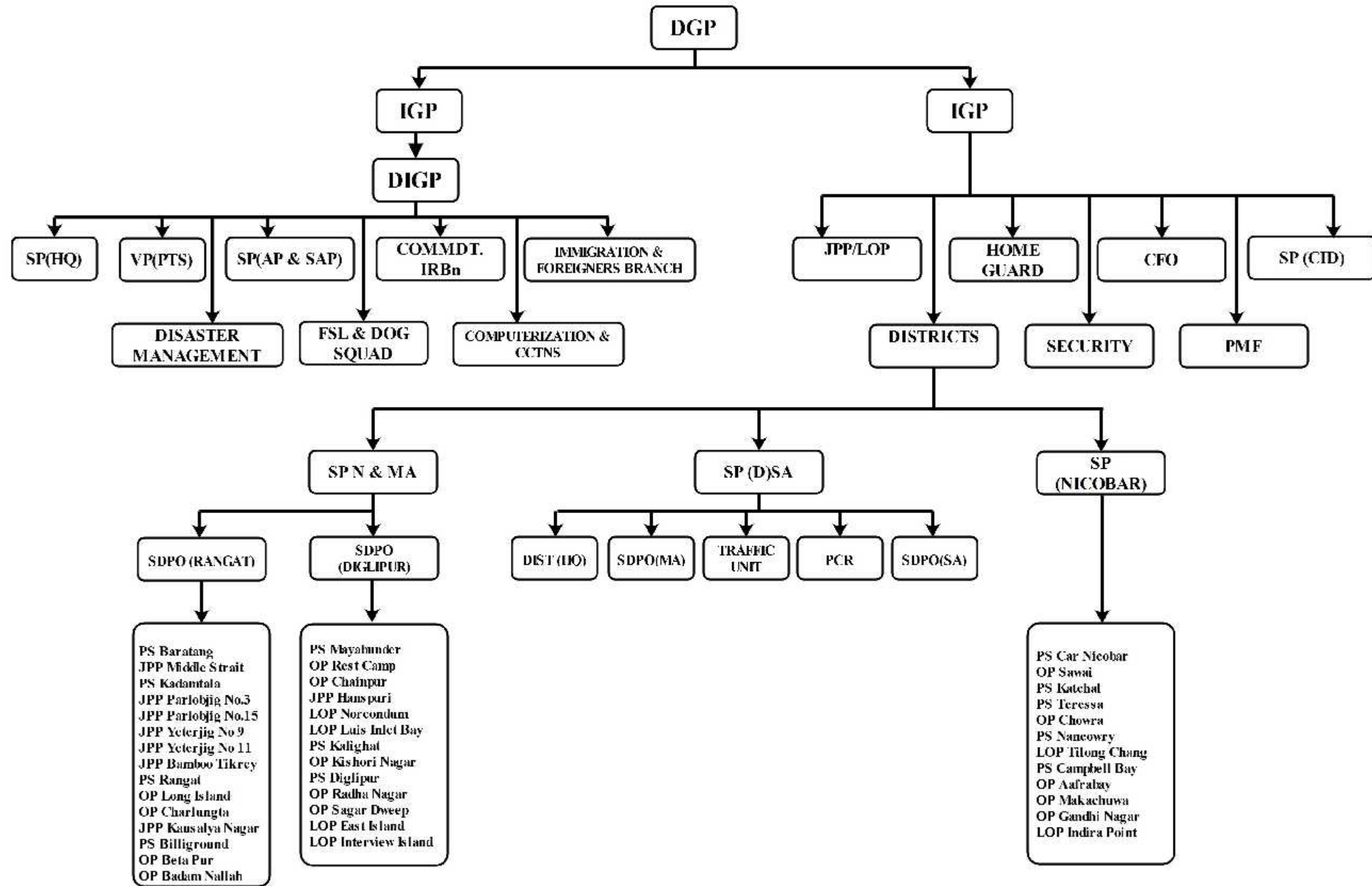
To respond to well founded criticism

(i) The particulars of its organization, functions and duties:

**General:** The history of A & N Police dates back to the year 1858 with the raising of "Sea Bundy Corps" for the protection of penal settlement. Today the A & N Police has a sanctioned strength of 4130 posts of various ranks in Civil Police, Criminal Investigation Department, Immigration Branch, Foreigners Branch, Motor Vehicle Section, Traffic branch, Security Unit, Forensic Science Laboratory, Finger Print Unit, Dog Squad, Special Armed Police, Armed Police, Island Communication, Fire Service Units and India Reserve Battalion.

The Executive Police is divided into three Districts viz., North & Middle Andaman District, South Andaman District and Nicobar District each headed by a District Superintendent of Police. North & Middle Andaman District consists of one Sub-Division (North Andaman) and South Andaman District consists two Sub-Divisions (Middle & South Andaman) each supervised by a Dy. Superintendent of Police. The Car Nicobar District, functions with its District HQ at Car Nicobar. A Sub-Divisional Office of Dy.S.P is located at Campbell Bay. There are 23 Police Stations, 23 reporting Out Posts, 12 Jarawa Protection Posts (JPP), 07 Look Out Posts (3 temporarily closed after Tsunami disaster), 23 Fire Stations, 24 Police Radio Stations and 209 VHF Stations in A & N Islands.
